DR SUZANNAH LIPSCOMB
HISTORIAN, AUTHOR AND BROADCASTER

A Visitor's Companion to Tudor England

Dr Suzannah Lipscomb was educated at Epsom College and Lincoln College, Oxford. After taking a double first in Modern History and gaining a distinction in her Masters in Historical Research, she won the Jowett Senior Scholarship at Balliol College, Oxford, to read her DPhil in History, which she was awarded in 2009.

In 2006-2007, Suzannah held a Royal Historical Society Marshall Research Fellowship at the Institute of Historical Research and, from 2007 to 2010, was Research Curator at Historic Royal Palaces, for which she still continues to act as a consultant and is an Advisory Member on their Research Strategy Board.

In 2010, Suzannah was appointed Lecturer in Early Modern History at the University of East Anglia and, in 2011, took up her post as Senior Lecturer and Convenor for History at New College of the Humanities, which opened its doors to its first student intake in September 2012. Suzannah's latest book, *A Visitor's Companion to Tudor England*, was published by Ebury in March 2012. She is also the author of *1536: The Year that Changed Henry VIII*, the co-author of *Henry VIII: 500 Facts* and co-editor of a forthcoming collection of essays, *Henry VIII and the Court: Art, Politics and Performance*.

Examples of her extensive television work include presenting *Bloody Tales of the Tower* on National Geographic and *Inside the World of Henry VIII* on History UK. As a royal historian, she commentated live from a studio at Buckingham Palace on the Royal Wedding for CTV and regularly appears on other television programmes, as well as radio. Her journalism has appeared in *The Telegraph*, *BBC History Magazine* and *History Today*.
